A £240 million investment made by Siemens Mobility in Goole Rail Village has been recognised with a Special Recognition Award at the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Chairman's Awards for the company's contribution to the local economy and community of East Yorkshire.

The award recognises the profound and positive impact Goole Rail Village has made to the area, including Siemens' support for local charities, schools, and community organisations.

As well as building trains, Goole Rail Village has components, logistics, innovation, office facilities, and a bogie assembly and service centre is being constructed. The village will bring 1,000 new jobs to the area, and another 1,700 opportunities in the supply chain.

Currently being assembled at the site are new trains for the Piccadilly line for Transport for London, which are due to start passenger service by the end of this year.

Following Hull Kingston Rovers' victory over Catalan Dragons to reach the Challenge Cup final at Wembley, Hull Trains have announced that a special additional service will operate on 7th June to take fans to the capital for the game against Warrington Wolves.

The Hull based open access operator has said that an additional morning departure will run for the exclusive use of Hull KR fans travelling to Wembley. The train will run non-stop from Hull to Kings Cross and will return to Hull in the evening.

This means that on the morning of 7th June, Hull Trains will be providing twenty carriages-worth of trains departing Hull for London Kings Cross before 9am!

Exciting news for the city of Hull is the proposed refurbishment of Paragon Station's former ticket office into a 'high-quality' bar! The railway station was recently seen on the Apple TV+ series Blitz featuring Saoirse Ronan. Unlike a lot of other stations, it still holds a lot of its original features and charm, and the new taproom would be a welcome addition.

The former ticket office holds both heritage and listed status, which means it'll be treated with care during a renovation which will bring back into use 600 sq m of unused floor space and create 15 full-time equivalent jobs.

The new project is part of wider regeneration works at Hull Paragon Interchange. It'll see Hull Tap Ltd awarded £315,000 for the works with plans including leather and hardwood fixed seating for around 150 customers, and a new bar counter in the former ticket office, which is currently occupied by WH Smith. They will be vacating the property with government funding of £146,250 going to WH Smith Travel Holdings Limited to relocate to the vacant unit next to Costa Coffee.

Cllr Paul Drake-Davis, portfolio holder for regeneration and housing at the council, said: "These awards are another great example of the potential that the city centre grant scheme can unlock. The former ticket office has stood vacant for many years, almost a decade, so it is pleasing that a large unit will be occupied thanks to grant funding.

"These awards are also helping to maintain city centre presence for a national brand in WH Smith, whilst safeguarding jobs at the same time. Morrisons' application for the station confirms that Hull is a place that high street brands want to be and will only add to the offering for commuters and passengers alike."
